President's Message

As this year comes to an end, it is time to reflect. With the passing of each year comes the promise of tomorrow. As I think about tomorrow, I see a beautiful new Pavilion standing where a 2500 square foot slab of concrete once lay. I see a new 1500 square foot storage facility where broken-down, pest-infested sheds once stood. I see a new dome atop our beloved St Basil Greek Orthodox Church, like a crown jewel.

But I also see storm clouds on the horizon.

To date, we are approximately \$130,000 short of achieving our Stewardship goal of \$385,000. This is a major concern. This past summer, the Parish Council had to borrow \$60,000 from the Precissi account to pay our bills to keep the lights on, the water flowing and to prevent checks from bouncing. To date, this money has not been repaid.

This cannot continue. If it does, the Precissi account, which is intended for capital improvements, will be depleted. (A capital improvement is the addition of a permanent structure or the restoration of a property that will either enhance the property's overall value or adapt it to new uses). And if it wasn't for the one-time \$130,000 we are receiving from the federal government and the \$30,000 we receive from renting our field to Lincoln Unified School District annually, our 2024 budget would be short \$65,000. Let me repeat that - short \$65,000.

I bring this matter to you all because I believe we can rise to the occasion and become self-reliant for our Operating Expenses primarily, if not exclusively, on Stewardship. I say this because I know how much this parish means to each and every one of you and how much God means to you. I also know that our Stewardship Committee is already working very hard to help us reach our potential for 2024; please take to heart their message for 2024 that they will be sharing with us on Stewardship Sunday, January 21 and via mailing.

After you hear from our Stewardship Committee, please fill out a Pledge Card and prayerfully consider giving your very best to our beloved parish. I believe with all my heart we can reach our goals and exceed them!

I would like to leave you with these words from the Gospel of *Luke* (6:38):

"Give, and it will be given to you".

A very and healthy Happy 2024 to you and yours.





Welcome Anthony, Danielle and Jarod!



I had always wanted to integrate a more formal awareness of prayer and God with

the hours throughout my day but, was never successful because of the pace of my daily life. Sr. Vassa was able to distill down the lengthy prayers to very short verses that encapsulate the meanings behind The Hours. It had a dramatic effect on my awareness of God and the times of day which are spiritually meaningful, enabling me to carry formal prayer into my day without becoming 'a monk' at work. I still am not successful every day at every one of the hours for prayer, but by setting my alarm for each of the hours, I am reminded to pray and reflect briefly during those times. I am thankful that God is patient and loving as we try to keep our awareness of Him, and this book helped me with that.

The Ladies Book Club is currently reading *"Growing in Christ: Shaped in His Image"* by Mother Raphaela. Here is what Presbyteria Angie has to say about the book: "Mother Raphaela offers beautifully written practical wisdom towards living the Christian life. This book is a simple and sweet read, part of a set of 3 books. Mother Raphaela teaches that how we participate in our church communities is crucial in demonstrating our love of neighbor. She offers compassionate commentaries that draw on the ancient wisdom of Orthodox spirituality and shows how it applies to our contemporary world.

Frederica Matthews-Green says, "Mother assesses all the failings and spiritual detours that keep us from having the character of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Christmas Concert performed by 'Doxologia' at St. Basil

On December 8th, the all male Romanian chanting group Doxologia, headed by our own Gabriel Cupsa along with his friends from Romania, Deacon Paul, Marian and Alin, performed a Christmas Carol Concert at Saint Basil's. Before this group performed, some of our youth and adults performed a few English carols. After this short performance, Doxologia had prepared four sets of carols, first the apolytikion of the Nativity was done by Dimitra in Greek, then in English by Gabriel and finally in Romanian by Doxologia. The second set consisted of Byzantine Christmas hymns. Third, Doxologia performed what they are most well known and well versed in, Romanian choral chant. Finally, the group closed the concert with a few traditional, in a different sense, carols with instruments, receiving a standing ovation before going into the hall for sweets and fellowship, as well as the opportunity to purchase a CD with carols recorded by Doxologia.

December 12th marks the feast day of Saint Spyridon, and as Doxologia was still in Stockton, they chanted the Divine Liturgy in the Romanian choral style. What a liturgy it was! Their chanting was so prayerful and being in Romanian, was quite a treat to hear during the worship of our Lord.

We thank Doxologia for their performance of the concert as well as the Divine Liturgy and pray for their safe return to Romania.



From a Small Seed, a Mighty Tree Has Grown

In East Africa, we have seen tremendous growth from when there were just a handful of clergy and one bishop covering all of Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda. Over the years, through the support of donors like you, the Church is being firmly established - clergy are being trained, evangelism and outreach ministries are being sponsored, churches, schools, and clinics are being built, wells are being drilled, and teams of volunteers and missionaries have been sent to help water the early seeds of the faith that had been planted. Through the steadfast prayers and support of Orthodox Christians like you, the number of parishes in Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda has grown, requiring the spiritual direction of ten Orthodox bishops (four in Kenya, and three each in Tanzania and Uganda) in different dioceses.

What's more, many of the ten bishops in East Africa, now serving hand in hand with missionary bishops from abroad, are African born. A critical reason why so many in the African Orthodox Church have been able to rise to vocations of spiritual leadership is because of the theological education offered through a handful of seminaries that have been established and sustained in Africa, distance learning offered through the St. Stephen's Program, opportunities to study in Greece and the United States, and ongoing mentorship.

To help support the Church in Africa's continued growth, the faithful like you are working through the Mission Center to establish three more seminaries in Africa. The parable shared by Christ in Matthew 13:31-32 has proven true: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and sowed in his field; and this is smaller than all other seeds, but when it is full grown, it is larger than the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and nest in its branches."



Indeed, a great tree of African Orthodoxy has grown from the seed that was first planted so many years ago. The tree continues to grow thanks to you.






