The change of perspective that the Faith offers us extends to our possessions, our talents, and our motivation. At least, it's supposed to!

As someone who has spent most of my adult life either as a police officer or in the nonprofit world, I can tell you that generosity is both addictive and life-giving.

It is. Studies have shown that generosity can have real psychological effects on one's behavior and mood...

- ... as Orthodox Christians, what medicine does the Faith offer us to develop healthy generosity? And why do the Fathers of the Church regularly discuss generosity as one of the three pillars of spiritual disciplines for Orthodox Christians?
- ... He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your resources and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way for great generosity, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God.
- ... Reaping and Sowing. Sadly, this idea has been so very much abused by some in American Christianity. Some have suggested that this has everything to do with "how much" you plant. But there is more to it than that shallow idea!

Reaping and sowing take thought, planning, purpose, and a sober mind. This principle of generosity flows from knowing about the Faith you are investing your life into.

- ... Freely Give. Shame, manipulation, and guilt will NEVER produce generosity. Never.
- ... The most negative comments from my preaching and teaching come when I talk about money and funding the Church, as the Church deserves to be supported. And that's because people either suffer from the notion they "have to" or are wounded from being "forced to." Out of that challenge flows all kinds of bad attitudes toward our possessions or priorities for our giving. When you see your giving change from being based on "need" to being motivated by "gratitude," you will become generous.
- ... Giving Cheerfully. The actual Greek word can be translated as "hilariously."

 Isn't that delightful? God wants us to give from a "hilarious heart." That heart will only be created in your chest from Faith and Love. When you are convinced that God loves you and that He is caring for you, you will be free to hold your life loosely in your hands instead of gripping your possessions to you to "ease" your fear of the future. When you give as God gives, then you are truly generous...

Today, what kind of "giver" are you? Are you attentive to the power of generosity to make you like Jesus Christ? Normal Orthodoxy is a generous and purposeful Orthodoxy. Is that who you are?




Interested in being part of the Parish Council?

Are you interested in being part of the Parish Council? According to Fr. Harakas, a well-known Orthodox theologian and Professor, "Parish councils help do the work of the church. And 'the work of the church' is to continue the work of Jesus Christ in the world. The council is one of the ways the laity of the Orthodox Church share in the church's work of preaching, teaching, blessing, sanctifying, directing, guiding and realizing the community of believers."

If you are interested in being on the Parish Council, or wish to nominate someone, here are a few things to keep in mind:

- If you wish to run for the PC or nominate someone, please pick up the Application for Parish Council Candidacy and other pertinent forms from the Church office. <u>The deadline to turn in the form is by Tuesday, Nov. 12 at 4:00pm</u> at the Church office.
- 2. Each term is for two years.
- All who wish to run for the Parish Council, whether incumbent Council members or new candidates, are required to attend a Parish Council Seminar. The date of the PC Seminar will be Tuesday, Nov. 12 at 7:00pm in the Fireside Room.
- 4. All who wish to run for the Parish Council must also be a member of good standing for at least one year. What does it mean to be in good standing?
 - Canonically Baptized and/or Chrismated in the Orthodox Church;
 - 18 Years of Age or over;
 - Live according to the tenets of the Orthodox faith;
 - Faithfully attend Divine Liturgy, observe Fast Days & participate in the sacraments such as Holy Communion and Confession;
 - New: Must complete Archdiocesan Youthworker On-line Training and Background Check
 - Contribute toward the progress of the sacred mission of the Church;
 - Remain current in stewardship obligation to the Church (the priest may waive this under special circumstances);
 - Cooperate in every way towards the well-being of the Parish.
- Date of Elections will be held on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>Dec. 8</u> immediately after the Divine Liturgy in the Fellowship Hall.







St. Basil's Bookstore

In the Orthodox Tradition it is customary for infants and adults to receive a cross at their baptism or chrismation. It is to be worn around the neck, not as an adornment for cosmetic purposes, but presupposes a witness and acknowledgement of Jesus Christ. Before the crucifixion the cross signified suffering, defeat, and death. With Christ's death on the Cross, it has become the symbol of triumph, salvation, and eternal life. The Cross is the first and greatest Christian sacred object. When the priest sanctifies the baptismal water, he immerses the Cross in it, and it becomes holy. The fathers of the church tell us that the devil fears the cross and flee from it. For this reason, the cross is to be worn for protection all the time.

Orthodox crosses come in assorted sizes and designs. The cross reflects a deeply personal relationship with Christ and a personal act of devotion. Wearing a cross serves as a reminder of their faith and commitment according to the teachings of Christ. The cross guards against physical and spiritual harm. Wearing a cross is an essential aspect of an Orthodox Christian identify.




