The Church's Purpose by Father Panagiotis Sotiras



As we begin a new Ecclesiastical Year on September 1, it's important to recall the Church's purpose because it is we, the parishioners, who are the Church, with the Christ as the head (Colossians 1:18). We--both clergy and laity--need to know this purpose so that we can make sure St. Basil's is acting like the Church and not just like some kind of exclusive club. So, what is our purpose here at St. Basil's? To answer that, let us reflect on a portion of the Gospel reading assigned for the first day of our New Church year (Luke 4:16-22):

"So, He [Jesus] came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up. And as His custom was, He went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day and stood up to read. And He was handed the book of the prophet Isaiah. And when He had opened the book, He found the place where it was written:

> "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, Because He has anointed Me To preach the gospel to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to the captives And recovery of sight to the blind, To set at liberty those who are oppressed; To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord."

Our Lord gave us the blueprint for what our parish, and all parishes for that matter, are here for. St. Basil's is here to preach the gospel to the poor—and poor can be understood to mean spiritually poor; in other words, those who are empty inside, those who are searching for meaning and purpose, those who are unfulfilled. The gospel means "Good News" in Greek, and so the Good News the Church has to offer is union with God, an intimate relationship with our loving Shepherd, which is what our soul and heart longs for, which is what gives us purpose, meaning and fulfillment.

The brokenhearted are those who have suffered in life in various ways--the Church is here to offer support, comfort and hope. The captives and oppressed are those who are imprisoned by their passions such as guilt, anger, shame, jealousy and fear—the Church is here to liberate us from these passions. The blind are those who are lost and confused—the Church is here to offer us the light of Christ, to help us make healthy choices that build us and others up, to help us make sense of life.

If St. Basil's is a parish where all these things are experienced, then it will truly be an "an acceptable year of the Lord" for us; our Lord will be well-pleased with us, and we will be fulfilling our purpose.

How do we have such a year acceptable to the Lord? First it starts (and it always starts) with our frequent participation in the liturgical services and our sacramental life. If we are to experience the blessings of union with God, it starts with corporate (and private) prayer and Holy Communion.

Our Lord said, "where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20)— this means that there is something special and essential when we gather for prayer with others, because the Lord is truly among is when we do so. In addition, our Lord said, "He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood abides in Me, and I in him." (John 6:56). Therefore, for us to be the Church, we need to be rooted and nourished by the liturgical prayers and sacraments.

Furthermore, to fulfill our purpose, we must strive to be loving and welcoming to all, both those in the parish and those who are not. We must resist cliques. We must resist any attitudes of superiority over those who might differ from us. We must show courtesy, kindness, compassion and mercy to all people. The Lord said, "By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35). Do we have love for one another, for our fellow parishioners, even when that love is not given? Do we desire that more and more people come to our Church, both Orthodox who are disconnected and the non-Orthodox? Let us remember that God Himself desires "all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. (1 Timothy 2:4)."

We fulfill our purpose at St. Basil's through our ministries, which are for all ages and for all people, both Orthodox and non-Orthodox. It is through our ministries that we learn about our faith and how it applies to our lives; it is through our ministries that we experience hope and comfort; it is through our ministries that we help one another carry "one another's burdens," thus fulfilling the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2). Our ministries also offer us the precious opportunity for connecting with others. The pandemic taught us much, but one of the things it taught us was the necessity for community. We are hard-wired to have relationships and friendships, and our various ministries offer us the antidote to isolation.

Lastly, we fulfill our mission by inviting (when the opportunity presents itself) family and friends to our parish, both Orthodox and non-Orthodox, so that they will experience what the Church is here to offer. Let us imitate the words Philip told Nathanael, "Come and see." (John 1:46). Let us to "come and see" for themselves the immense blessings that our Church has to offer.

As we prepare to begin a new year, let us remember what the Church is here for and how our role is essential for making sure the Church fulfills Her divine purpose.

On the Feast of Saints Peter & Paul, who laid the foundation for Orthodox missions, St. Basil Greek Orthodox Church in Stockton, CA hosted an OCMC retreat entitled Orthodoxy & the Apostolic Spirit. Former OCMC Missionary, Anastasia Barksdale was the main speaker. The event with attended by inquirers, catechumen and lifelong learners from eight local parishes. The program began with the Divine Liturgy, followed by a chrismation.

The retreat program began with introductions and icebreakers and a presentation by Anastasia Barksdale on the Foundations of Orthodox Mission. Fr. Pete Sotiris and Fr. Gabriel Cupsa helped lead the small group discussions as well as Patricia Manuse and Roberta Sardell, both former OCMC mission team members. Each of the small groups worked together to create "mission statement". Which they shared during the concluding session as they discussed, "What's My Mission?" All the participants left with a greater understanding of the role missions plays in their personal spiritual journey.

Hello Students and Parents,

Welcome to the **2024 -2025 school year**. I am looking forward to seeing all of our students again. We have been keeping busy over the summer. In addition to summer school, we installed an "info wall" in the hallway near the fireside room (between the 2 built in bookcases), and the Sunday School office has received a "face-lift" with new paint, bookcases and a desk. This has allowed for better organization of materials and supplies so our teachers may easily locate any resources they may need for their lessons.

Former parishioner **Carole Lew** died following a long illness. A resident of Stockton for many years, Carole moved to Oakland about ten years ago and was active in veteran's groups in the Bay Area. Her funeral took place at Chapel of the Palms on Friday, July 19 at noon, followed by committal at the Chinese Cemetery in French Camp. God bless Carole's long journey!

Long time parishioner and Lodi resident Nicholas "Nick" Aftias died at his home on May 27. He was born March 18,1933 in Samos, Greece to parents Licourgos and Fotini Aftias. He earned an engineering degree before immigrating to Canada at 18. Kiriaki Geralis joined him soon after and they were married in 1954 where Nick began his career in the restaurant business while living in Montreal. He then worked for the Canadian Railroad and in 1958 moved his family to Vancouver where he opened a restaurant. The family moved to Lodi in 1968 so "Kiki" could be reunited with her brothers and sisters. He managed the New Yorker restaurant in Lodi until 1974 with his nieces and nephews, Dr. Ken and Angie Frangadakis and Michael and Pattie Frangadakis opened YasooYani in downtown Stockton; Nick became sole owner in 1975. After retiring he began growing grapes in 1973 and at age 88 started in almonds. He was a founding member of Lodi Hellenic Society and when the society decided to disband, they donated nearly \$70,000 to St. Basil's and the Church created three memorial scholarships to honor Nick and two other founding members, Steve Facaros and Bill Panagopoulos. He loved hosting events at his home, especially for Orthodox Easter. He was preceded in death by his parents and his brother, John Aftias. He is survived by his wife of nearly 70 years, children Fotini Maria Aftias, Licourgos "Leo" Aftias, and Dimitri "Jim" Aftias (Susan); grandchildren Nick Aftias (Rhiannon), Thomas Aftias (Edlyn), Alexis Aftias Mertz, Christine Aftias-Sanchez and Michael Aftias, 8 great-grandchildren and his sister Vasili's Kritikos in Montreal. May his memory be eternal!

Lodi resident and garage owner in that city died April 8, 2024. **John Zarefakis**, 72, was born August 29, 1952. The Trisagion was at St. Basil Church April 16 followed by the funeral the following day, the 17th. Committal was at Cherokee Memorial Park. (No obituary available). Memory eternal.

Kathleen Farros-Hoeppner recently participated in the Sacramento Fine Arts Show and was awarded Best of Show in the Sculpture category. The popular restaurant was opened in 1974 has never fully recovered from the pandemic closure and the slowdown following the exodus of downtown banks and businesses. For decades Yasoo catered to the downtown breakfast and lunch crowd - judges of San Joaquin County Superior Court commandeered their own table. In the '70s and '80s Greek nights featured Bouzouki music and belly dancing. They expanded in the '80s from 55 seats to 120 and also catered Makarias and banquets. The charter school next to Yasoo Yani's are planning on expanding into the restaurant space - end of a beautiful era of dining in downtown Stockton.

Nicole Bestolarides, daughter of Ted and Kelley, will graduate in December from University of Glasgow, Scotland, with a Master's degree in Digital Archiving. She will return to the States following graduation.

On May 2024 Nikki Karapanos graduated from Sonoma State University with a master's degree in Cultural Resources

currently working as an archaeologist at AECOM, a global infrastructure consulting firm. She can be found at a construction site in San Francisco or surveying the remote landscapes of the greater Bay Area.

This course explores the lives and legacies of Byzantine holy women from the mid-fourth through fifteenth centuries. A rich variety of interdisciplinary sources including hagiography, iconography, portraiture, architecture, legal codices, letters, encomia, hymnography, and historiography (the writing of history) will inform our understanding of how female sanctity was constructed, communicated, and venerated in the Byzantine period, as well as the impact Byzantine female saints made on the physical and spiritual landscapes of city and society.

About the Instructor

Dr. Anysia Metrakos is a historian of the later Roman Empire (Late Antiquity) whose work centers on the impact of Christianity on Roman society, gender, and law. She received her doctorate from the Graduate Group in Ancient History and Mediterranean Archaeology from University of California, Berkeley, and has lectured in Classical Studies and History at Tufts University. Her current research and book project follow the socio-economic effects and legal implications of founding and financing elite female monastic communities in fifth and sixth century Constantinople. Dr. Metrakos lives in the San Francisco Bay Area with her husband (Fr. Nicholas) and their four children.




